

# Affidavit

I, Stuart, hereinafter “Affiant”, do solemnly affirm, declare and state as follows:

1. Affiant is competent to state the matters set forth herein.
2. Affiant has knowledge of the facts stated herein.
3. All the facts herein are true, complete and admissible as evidence, and if called upon as a witness, Affiant will testify to their veracity.

**Plain statement of facts:**

4. According to *Stair*, in Scotland, the sovereign power is the same as *dominium eminens*. See Exhibit ‘B’, para 42.
5. According to *Stair*, in Scotland, *dominium eminens* is allodial. See Exhibit ‘B’, para 47.
6. According to *Stair*, in Scotland, the holder of the allodial title (the Crown) has sovereignty, jurisdiction and the means to hold courts and dispense justice. See Exhibit ‘B’, para 42.
7. According to *Stair*, in Scotland the sovereign power equals allodial ownership. The Crown cannot dispense land without relinquishing sovereignty. See Exhibit ‘B’, note 4 to para. 42.
8. No other aspect of sovereignty, such as prerogative, is superior to that established by allodial ownership.
9. The United Kingdom includes Scotland.
10. The United Kingdom Crown does not own the allodial title of Shetland.
11. The United Kingdom Crown lacks the fundamental requirement for sovereignty in Shetland.
12. In the absence of the United Kingdom Crown’s sovereignty there is no evidence to show that Shetland is part of Scotland.
13. There is ample evidence to show that Shetland could not at any time have become part of Scotland. See *Stolen Isles*.
14. In the absence of the United Kingdom Crown’s sovereignty, there is no evidence to show that Shetland is part of The United Kingdom.
15. There is ample evidence to show that Shetland could not at any time have become part of The United Kingdom. See *Stolen Isles*.
16. In the absence of the United Kingdom Crown’s sovereignty, United Kingdom legislation with effect in Scotland has no effect in Shetland.
17. In the absence of the United Kingdom Crown’s sovereignty, Scottish legislation has no effect in Shetland.

18. Land in Shetland is udal. See Exhibit 'B', para 47.
19. Udal land in Orkney and Shetland is allodial. See Exhibit 'B', para 47.
20. Udal land owners own the allodial title of their land in Shetland.
21. By the Scottish definition, the udal land owners have sovereignty in Shetland.
22. In the absence of the United Kingdom Crown's sovereignty, no organisation working under United Kingdom legislation has any authority to act in Shetland.
23. In the absence of the United Kingdom Crown's sovereignty, no organisation working under Scottish legislation has any authority to act in Shetland.
24. Individuals employed by such organisations have no authority to act in Shetland.
25. Said individuals, in the knowledge that Shetland is not part of Scotland, by their actions are complicit in a fraud.
26. Said individuals act at their own personal liability.
27. It is a fundamental principle of law that nobody is above the law including, but not limited to all government actors and;
28. Immunity from prosecution only applies when said actors are performing the actions of their office in good faith.
